Also, we should also have Minister for AI from UAU here. I don't know if he is here or not. He is not here. Yeah, maybe, you know, our meeting was somehow a little bit delayed.

Dear colleagues, I am very pleased to come back to the podium, but with very special rules to close this AI for Good Summit this year.

It's exciting to see a movement take root. What we created one year ago here together is now becoming a global movement, the AI for Good movement. And it is unstoppable. You heard our female astronauts today talk about our planet as our home. Over the last three days, you have shown that AI can help us protect our home and improve the lives of all those who live in it. Because of the Sustainable Development Goals provide us with a diverse set of challenges, we needed to mobilize a diverse set of expertise, and here lies the strength of our movement.

We are all here in it today together, and every government, every company, every academical institution, every civil society organization, every one of us should consider how AI will affect our future. When we started our discussions three years ago, our objective was to connect AI innovators with public and privacy sector decision-makers, so that they can take promising strategies forward. I am pleased to tell you that this Summit has built support for more than 30 projects.

Now, let me express my gratitude to our partners of this event, the XPRIZE Foundation and ACM, as well as all our 32 partners from UN agencies. I had a wonderful conversation with them yesterday at lunchtime. I was very encouraged by very good teamwork and very strong support from each of them to have our collective work with our industries, with academia, with our civil society organizations.

I would also like to thank our sponsors, ACM, The Kay
Family Foundation, the kingdom of Saudi Arabia, the PWC, as
well as EY, the Zero Abuse Project, and the Sage Foundation.
My special thanks to the committees that organized the Summit,
to all speakers and moderators, to the more than 800
participants from more than 60 countries to this event. And
to the ITU staff engaged with the event. Let's give them a
big round of applause.

We have to work much harder to try to reach out to those regions where we have less participants. But less participants does not mean that they don't have the work. And if you visit the Africa continent, you will find plenty of activities inspired by AI. Run by our young generation of engineers and experts there. So that we have to try to work more and to reach to those areas we have still poor participation at this Summit.

Have a safe journey home. I hope each of you will return home full of new ideas, new projects, and renewed sense of purpose and possibilities. I think that the Summit we will have reports and further information published on our website, and I hope you will have a chance, have a time to access to those websites to get updated information from us, and of course, we also encourage those email groups we established through these three days to be actively cooperated and communicated with each other so that we will benefit from your active contributions from now on, and we look forward to good cooperations with all of you.

So ladies and gentlemen, let me just once more, again, express my sincere thanks to all of you for your active

contributions, and to our team who supported this event and to our sponsors, and wish you a very nice evening. And I don't know whether you will join those who like to go to the restaurant to enjoy the pizza or the others, but anyhow, enjoy the wonderful evening today. Thank you very much.
