






ITU wide Tracking – Engagement Index




Detailed participation view

Big picture: Current situation

ITU-T is at its highest level of membership ever.


It's more diverse than ever.

Same for ITU overall.

Long-term trends

- Prising membership from 1960s up to about 2001. This was a peak for the period.
- Decline between 2001 to 2016 Global groups consolidation of memberships / M&As / closures in early 2000s.
- Between 2001 and 2023, 50% drop in Sector Membership but almost 20x increase in Associates
- Membership rising again since 2017.
- Totals are now at highest level ever, but fees flat
 - Revenues fell from 12.4M in 2001 to 7.9M in 2023

ITU-T Membership Growth + Revenues



ITU-T Membership More Diverse than ever ...

- Developed country industry participation declined, developing country industry increase from 2001-2023.
- Ratio shift: 77/23 to 65/35

ITU-T Industry Regional Participation

- Associate category grew across all regions.
- Significant Associate increases in EUR, ASP and AMS
- Mostly Sector Member declines, especially AMS & EUR.
- Sector Members grew significantly in ARB


ITU-T SME Membership

SME Associate reduced fee since 2020 (Res 209/PP18)

30% of ITU-T Associates are companies that benefit from the SME



These SMEs account for about 16% of ITU-T's industry membership




ITU-T Industry – Meeting Participation

- From about2.8K attendees up to5.2K

Recap on trends and current situation

- Overall, ITU-T industry participation is rising. Highest ever.
- More diverse membership.
 SMEs. Regional balance.
 Developing / developed
 - Fewer sector members, many more associates
 - SMEs account for significant percent of new members.
- Participation and contributions: Rising overall, biggest gains in Asia
