Why you don't often see Cisco at the ITU-T

- Reasons:
 - There is a rich ecosystem of standards organizations
 - Cost of participation is quite high (not enough virtual engagement)
 - Too many science experiments made into Recommendations
 - Technical excellence can be traded off against policy objectives
- ITU technical standards are often not relevant to Cisco or have been overtaken elsewhere
 - Nothing from SGs 11, 13, and 20
 - Almost nothing from SGs 2 and 3
 - Limited relevance for SGs 5, 9, 12, 15, 16, and 17

- ... the ITU-T to generate Recommendations for new protocols and formats
 - But we do need you to maintain those that are well deployed.
- ... the ITU-T to manage internet resources, but only because governments have engaged well at ICANN.

 - Internet usage, societal engagement
- Good measurement methodologies
- Policy makers and regulators to share their views in a constructive dialog
- ... the ITU-T enhance its collaboration with other standards organizations
- ... facilitation of participation by all
