As of today, more than 150 cities including Dubai, Singapore, Valencia, Mashhad, Moscow, and Daegu have implemented these KPIs, with more cities expected to follow suit in the coming years.

As we stand today, the U4SSC continues to serve as a gateway for partnership building between cities, governments, private sector and NGOs.

We were able to publish 5 new deliverables since the last U4SSC meeting.

All this would not have been possible without the dedicated efforts of all the U4SSC Leaders and the 17 United Nations entities, who have helped keep the U4SSC afloat during the testing pandemic times and ensured that work continues for revitalizing the global smart city partnerships and sharing knowledge, with the aim of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

Last but not the least, we are also lucky to have you all – the U4SSC participants who continue to contribute to the activities of U4SSC, with the same level of zest and optimism as you did before the pandemic, which has allowed for us to effectively further the global discourse on smart and sustainable cities and complete our deliverables.
