





As part of the general mandate of UN Women (UN General Assembly resolution 64/289,) and in the framework of the UN SWAP, the Training Centre (TC) has developed the following training resources to be made available to the UN System.

UN Women Training Centre Courses

I know Gender: An introduction to gender equality and women's empowerment for UN System staff

Course objective:

This course aims to develop and/or strengthen understanding and awareness of basic concepts of gender equality and women's empowerment to all UN staff at HQ and at regional and country levels, and promote a first step towards behavioral change and the integration of a gender perspective into everyday work for all UN System staff. It provides a background of general knowledge and information on gender equality and women's empowerment.

Course content:

Three main modules: a common denominator for all UN System staff:

1) Gender Concepts to get Started

2) Human Rights Framework and Global Standards for Gender Equality 3) Promoting Gender Equality through the System. This module includes an introduction to the UN Gender architecture and strategies to address the challenges to advancing gender equality and the empowerment of women. Cost: Free

Languages: English (to be translated to French and Spanish)

Duration: 2.5 hours (3 mandatory modules)

Learning mode: Online and self-paced

When: Anytime starting in April 2014

ITU will now take the promotion of gender equality a step further by recognizing the current work individuals and professionals are contributing to gender empowerment in the field of ICTs by launching its first *ITU Gender Award*, to be presented at the Plenipotentiary Conference 2014 (PP-14) in Busan, Republic of Korea.

HOW WE GOT TO THE CONCEPT?

Following the establishment of UN Women by the UN General Assembly in 2010, ITU's 2010 Plenipotentiary Conference adopted Resolution 70 highlighting the role ICTs have in advancing gender equality and women's empowerment. Furthermore, the resolution instructs the ITU Council to continue initiatives to accelerate the gender mainstreaming process in the Union.

Respectively, ITU unveiled a Gender Equality and Mainstreaming Policy (GEM) initiative during its 2013 Council session, accompanied by an Action Plan underscoring the need to mainstream gender in all of its facets. ITU Secretary-General, Dr Hamadoun I Touré personally highlighted the significance an award would play in celebrating the contributions women have made in ICTs.
