# Curriculum Vitae: GULATI, Archana Goyal (Ms.)

### 1. Work Experience

I am a career civil servant and a telecom policy expert with almost 30 years of experience. An economist with degrees in law, management and public administration, my expertise extends to nearly all aspects of telecom / ICTs policy and regulation and includes policy, regulation and implementation in the unique context of problems faced by developing countries. I am particularly interested in Universal Service Regulation. This was the topic of my essay paper for my LLM (International IT & Telecom law) degree from the University of Strathclyde, U.K., and the subject matter of my ongoing PhD research on Universal Service Regulation institute of Technology, New Delhi.

My educational background when combined with my vast work experience in the sphere of ICTs policy & regulation with the Department of Telecommunications and my regulatory experience working with the Competition Commission places me in a unique position as a policy expert who is not only abreast with latest technologies and regulatory challenges and trends, but also has intensive implementation experience and the requisite legal and economic training.

My regulatory experience has also involved working with / for international organizations over past the decade. These include as the International Telecommunications Union (ITU), Commonwealth Telecom Organization (CTO), International Competition Network (ICN) and UN Women and United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) and the ICT's Regulators of South Africa (as trainer) and Mexico (as expert panelist).
