5. South Africa International Airport O R Tambo International

O.R. Tambo International Airport is Africa's biggest and busiest airport, facilitating over 21 million passengers a year. More than 50 per cent of South Africa's air travelling passengers are facilitated through the airport.

The OR Tambo International Airport is situated in the Kempton Park district of Johannesburg, 23 km north-west of the city centre and 46 km south of Pretoria City Centre. It is one of the few airports in the world with scheduled passenger flights to all 6 inhabited continents and also serves as a gateway to many sub-Saharan countries.

Formerly, Jan Smuts Airport, it has been renamed in honour of the late and former ANC President, Oliver Reginald Tambo, more commonly referred to as OR Tambo.

Its formal aviation references are IATA Airport Code - JNB and IACO Airport Code - FAOR, and it is commonly abbreviated to by passengers by its acronym 'ORTIA'

Please note that O R Tambo International is a silent airport, no boarding calls for passengers will be made.

6. Ground Transportation

OR Tambo is located 33 kilometers/ 20.5 miles to Sandton (33 minutes), main city for the Venue. Delegates have the following options for travelling from the airport to their hotel:

Airport Transfer: The airport is served by a large number of taxis, shuttles, and buses, which can be found outside the arrival's hall. ICASA will have a station on arrivals hall to assist guests with their choice of transport mode and needs.

Gautrain: The Gautrain is a mass rapid transit railway system, which will get the delegates from the Airport to the Sandton train station in less than 15 minutes. UBER and Taxify: South Africa offers this mode of transportation, it's cheaper and makes it easier to move in and around the city. Download either one from your mobile App to allow you to explore the city. Our service desk will also assist guest in access these on arrival

B. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Visa formalities

Applying for a South African

A visa simply indicates that your application has been reviewed at a South African embassy, mission or consulate and that the consular officer has determined you are eligible to enter the country for a specific purpose.

The visa will allow you to travel to a South African port of entry where an immigration official will then determine if you are allowed to enter South Africa and for how long you can stay for that particular visit. Visitors are restricted to the activity or purpose for which their visas were issued.

On entry to South Africa, a visa is considered to be a visitor's permit. The permit's period of validity is calculated from the date of entry into the country and will be set out under the heading "conditions" on the visa label. You must ensure that you apply for the correct visa/permit. Entry in the country may be refused if the purpose of visit was not correctly stated.

Visitors' visas are for international travellers (citizens of other countries) who have permanent residence outside South Africa and who wish to visit the country on a temporary basis for tourism or business purposes for a period of 90 days or less.

2. Vaccinations

All delegates are encouraged to keep themselves updated on routine vaccinations while travelling to any destination. Below is a list of vaccines for the delegates as advised by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

Hepatitis A

CDC recommends this vaccine because as hepatitis A can be transmitted through contaminated food or water in South Africa, regardless of where you are eating or staying.

Typhoid

Typhoid can also be transmitted through contaminated food or water. CDC recommends this vaccine for most travellers, especially if the travellers will be staying with friends or relatives, visiting smaller cities or rural areas, or if the traveler is an adventurous eater.

Yellow fever

There is no risk of yellow fever in South Africa. The South Africa government requires proof of yellow fever vaccination only if you are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever. This does not include the US. If you are travelling from a country other than the US, check this list to see if you may be required to get the yellow fever vaccine: [Countries with risk of yellow fever virus \(YFV\) transmission.](#)

To Note: No vaccination certificate is required for entering South Africa, [although it is strongly recommended travellers vaccinate against yellow fever, hepatitis A and B](#)

The official measuring system in South Africa is the international metric system.

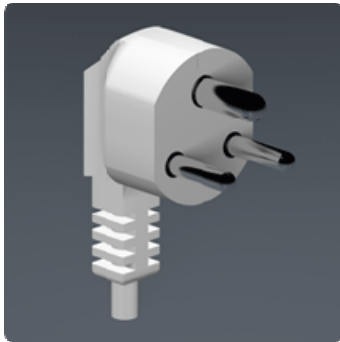
5. Driving sense

In South Africa vehicles circulate on the left side

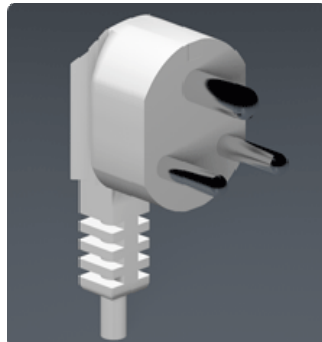
6. Electricity supplying

In South Africa the power plugs and sockets are of type D, M and N. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.

7. Climate

South Africa has a lovely, temperate climate with plenty of sunny, dry days and afternoon thundershowers. The main factors influencing conditions are altitude and the surrounding oceans, The temperatures for this time of the year range between 22° to 26°. Being in the Southern Hemisphere, South Africa has seasons opposite to Europe or North America.

8. Currency

The currency of South Africa is the Rand (sign: R; code: ZAR) is. The Rand is subdivided into 100 cents (sign: "c"). The ISO 4217 code is ZAR. The Rand is the legal tender in the Common Monetary Area between South Africa, Swaziland (Eswatini), Lesotho and Namibia, although the last three countries do have their own currencies pegged at par with rand.

9. Shopping – VAT refunds

Delegates must note that they can receive a refund of the value added tax (15 per cent) levied on domestic products purchased from outlets belonging to the “Global Refund” system, provided the amount paid (per invoice) is over \$50 .

11. Tipping at Restaurants

Restaurant tipping in South Africa:

A tip of 10% – 20% is standard but do check with the manager as some restaurants in South Africa add on a standard service charge to tables with over a certain number of guests. If you tip over and above this included charge it is unlikely your error will be pointed out and your tip will be seen as rewarding exceptional service over and above the basic charge. It is customary to leave 10% - 20% gratuity in coffee bars and restaurants and to tip porters, doormen and cinema/theatre ushers. This is not mandatory.
