
Highlights

- Persistent urban-rural gap in mobile-broadband network coverage and in Internet access at home
- Slower rollout of infrastructure
- Declining mobile-cellular subscriptions
- High Internet use among youth

Population coverage by type of mobile network and area, 2020*





Population coverage by type of mobile network and area, 2020*





Percentage of households with Internet access at home and with a computer, 2005-2019*






Percentage of households with Internet access at home, by urban/rural area, 2020*















Mobile-cellular telephone subscriptions per 100 inhabitants, by development status


