Predictable quarterly release schedule


Easy to use – minimal learning

 Connectedness - push notifications, links to NS programs, social media




Universal Apps: Multi-Hazard




- App can save user location ensuring they have most up-to-date information
- Geo-targeted notifications allow for emergency info to be focused on specific areas
- 'What Now' guidance messages are sent with alerts to give immediate actions
- Toolkit featuring torch, strobe, alarm and "I'm safe" message sharing




Hazards Alerting Platform: Ingest and Generate CAP


- The platform receives existing CAP/data feeds from alerting organisations such as USGS, Met Offices.
- Hazards are tagged with a 'what now' message and linked to further in app content.
- Agencies without a CAP originator are setup with a login in the Hazards platform to send attributed geo-targeted alerts.











Hazard App User Experience

CAP Feed on WhatNow Portal




Alert Detail on WhatNow Portal






