**STOCKS MARKED** trading the Dow Jones Industrial Average above 10,000 and the S&P 500 Composite Index above 3,000 for the first time in months. 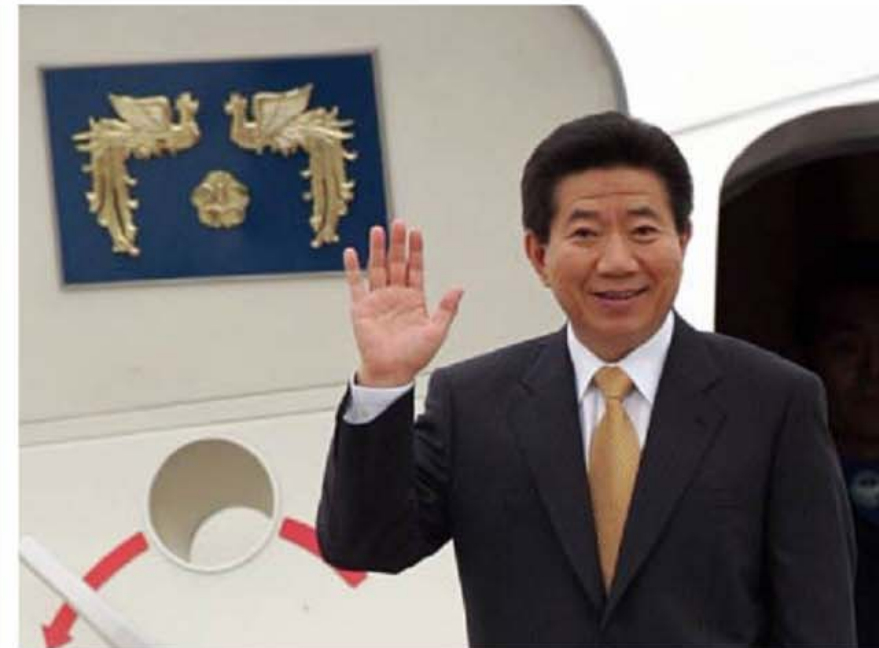

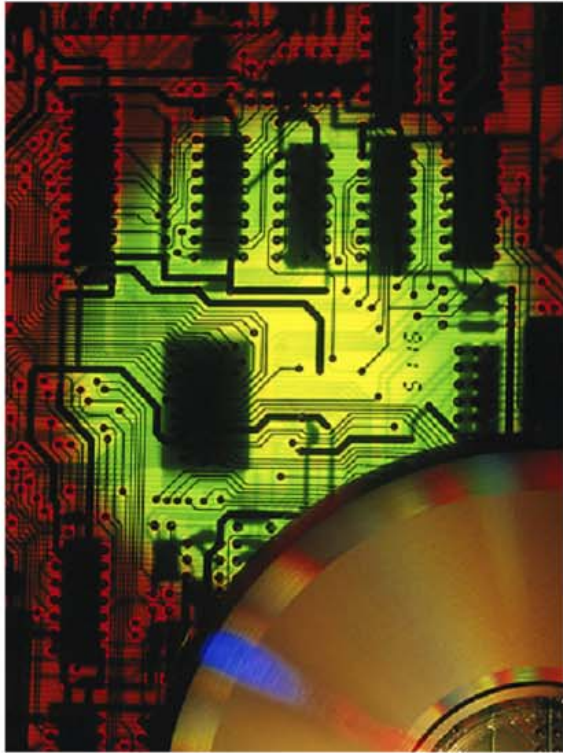
